Overall purpose of the job:

To be responsible for a major support function of the Centre in a planned maintenance schedule of the Centre's craft and ancillary equipment, buildings and trailers as well as coaching timetabled activities and Centre fleet management.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. To ensure that the workshops and the workshop plant, stores and equipment are safe, properly maintained and effectively managed.
- 2. To be the RYA Principal and play an active role as an instructor in the activities programme.
- 3. To be responsible for the maintenance of the Centre's craft to a recognised safe standard.
- 4. To prepare and monitor a Budget for the workshop expenditure in collaboration with the Centre Director.
- 5. To agree a programme with the Centre Director and to carry out the maintenance of the Centre's craft, ancillary, buildings fixtures and other equipment.
- 6. To ensure that the Centre's trailers are kept in a roadworthy condition and to arrange for/or undertake the necessary maintenance.
- 7. To maintain the necessary records and account to the Centre Director for all expenditure incurred in boat maintenance and associated activities.
- 8. To train and enable the staff, members and others involved in the Centre to assist with the maintenance of the Centre's craft, ancillary and other equipment where possible.
- 9. To attend meetings of the Centre, when requested by the Management Committee or the Centre Director and write reports when requested.
- 10. To undertake the role of Local Health and Safety contact for:
 - (i) workshop and associated stores
 - (ii) marine equipment
 - (iii) trailers
- 11. To ensure activities are conducted in accordance with the centre's policies.

Duties common to all full time staff

- 1. To be a full member of the Centre's staff team to enable the Centre to achieve its wider aims and objectives.
- 2. To know the Centre's policies on Safety and Equal Opportunities. To implement these policies through individual work practices & the services the Centre offers.
- 3. To have a responsible attitude to the use of Centre equipment and facilities and to encourage a similar attitude amongst other users.
- 4. To further his/her own development through training.
- 5. To maintain links with Local and National Outdoor Education Organisations as appropriate.
